- Nephrogenic systemic fibrosis
- Chronic graft versus host disease
- Lichen sclerosus

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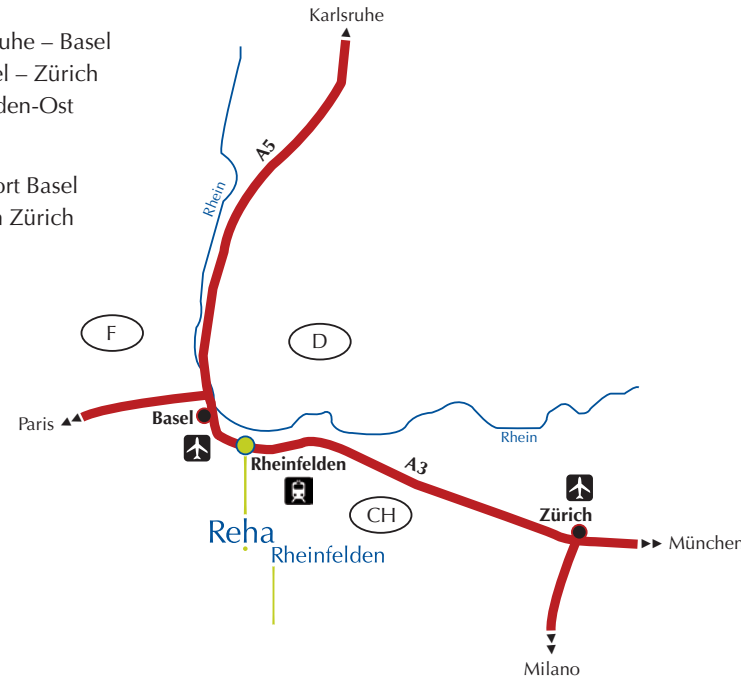

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Scleroderma
...a disease with many faces

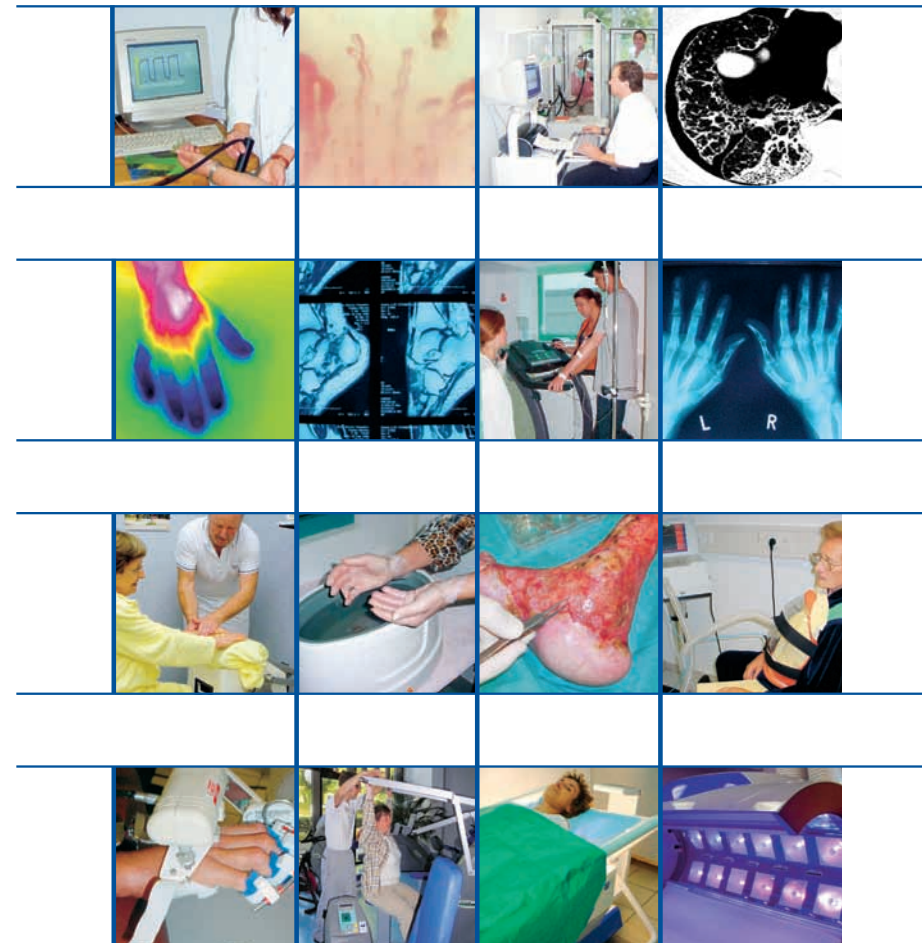
Scleroderma has many different faces, be it in the circumscribed and pansclerotic form limited to the skin, or as part of a systemic sclerosis. Almost every organ can be affected, apart from the skin mainly the blood vessels, lung, kidney, heart, the musculoskeletal system, and the nervous system. The course of the illness can be acute or chronic and can lead to serious complications including death.

Not only adults, but also children can be affected. There are a variety of diseases which are similar in appearance and need to be differentiated from Scleroderma.



...diverse problems with Scleroderma require extensive solutions

The above mentioned organ disturbances and complications require a thorough assessment and a medical treatment concept which takes into account the specific needs of the individual patient. Paramount in the treatment is the collaboration of an expert multi-disciplinary team with specific experience in Scleroderma, comprising doctors with different specialities, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, sports therapists, speech and language therapists, dieticians, certified wound care nurses, as well as creative therapists and clinical psychologists.



Specialist therapies:

- Drug therapy (including immunosuppression and immune modulation)
- Physical therapies (including UVA1-therapy, full body hyperthermia, biomechanical stimulation)
- Physiotherapy (including lymph drainage, connective tissue massage, medical training therapy)
- Occupational therapy (including ergonomic advice, provision of aids, domiciliary assessment)
- Speech and language therapy (therapy for swallowing disorders and hoarseness)
- Treatment of chronic non healing wounds (modern wound management)
- Diagnostic and therapeutic anaesthesia for pain control
- Chiropractic
- Traditional Chinese Medicine (including acupuncture and phytotherapy)
- Clinical psychology and neuropsychology
- Creative therapies (music therapy, dance therapy)
- Dietary advice
- Patient education
